

Lewis and Clark Community College Transfer Guide for Saint Louis University's School for Professional Studies 2006-2007

Requirements for the Bachelor's Degree in the School for Professional Studies

This transfer guide is designed to assist students in choosing courses at Lewis and Clark Community College that will fulfill core requirements for the School for Professional Studies at Saint Louis University. Courses not listed in this articulation agreement may transfer to Saint Louis University as elective credit or credit for the major, depending on the appropriateness of the particular courses. As a general policy, transfer credit will be awarded for college level coursework in which a grade of "C" or better is earned. No credit, for example, is granted for courses in performance-based physical education, developmental, or technical areas.

A maximum of 64 credit hours earned at the community college can be applied towards the Bachelor's Degree in the School for Professional Studies. All coursework will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis for transfer credit, regardless of if the Associate's Degree has been earned.
