WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I MAKE A REPORT?

STUDENTS WHO MAKE A REPORT CAN EXPECT TO RECEIVE A DETAILED EMAIL FROM THE TITLE IX COORDINATOR THAT WILL EXPLAIN THEIR RIGHTS, OPTIONS, AND AVAILABLE RESOURCES.

THE EMAIL WILL INCLUDE AN INVITATION TO MEET WITH THE TITLE IX COORDINATOR TO FURTHER DISCUSS THE STUDENTS' NEEDS, AND ADDRESS ANY QUESTIONS.

IT IS UP TO THE STUDENT WHETHER OR NOT THEY WANT TO PURSUE THE MEETING WITH TITLE IX AFTER RECEIVING THIS EMAIL.

IS MY REPORT CONFIDENTIAL?

THE TITLE IX COORDINATOR WILL NOT SHARE THE INFORMATION REPORTED, UNLESS THERE IS AN EMERGENCY SITUATION THAT REQUIRES THE INFORMATION TO BE SHARED, OR IF THE STUDENT REQUESTS THE INFORMATION TO BE SHARED.

STUDENTS OFTEN REQUEST THAT THE TITLE IX COORDINATOR SHARE THEIR INFORMATION TO IMPLEMENT SUPPORTIVE MEASURES, SUCH AS: HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS, ACADEMIC NOTIFICATIONS, COUNSELING APPOINTMENTS, ETC.
