B.S. Major in Psychology

- The B.S. Major in Psychology requires
 36 credit hours.
- A minimum of 18 credits
 must be taken from the
 department, including PSY
 2010 Disciplines & Practices
 in Psychology, PSY 2050,
 PSY 3060, and PSY 4010 for
 which transfer credit is not
 accepted.
- There are no requirements to declare for students new to SLU. Declaration of the psychology major after admission to SLU requires a C or better in PSY 1010 General Psychology and a SLU PSY GPA of 2.00 or better.
- A grade of C or better in PSY 1010 General Psychology, a B- or better in PSY 2050, and a SLU PSY GPA of 2.00 or better are required to remain a psychology major. Students who fall short may remain on probation for 2 semesters.
- Upon declaration, all new majors must meet with Dr. Kinnucan to review the curriculum, their professional goals, and departmental opportunities. A permanent faculty mentor is selected at this meeting. Requests to change faculty mentors should be emailed to psychug@slu.edu.

Getting Started (6 credits)

These courses should be taken early in the major. They are best taken prior to the completion of the sophomore year.

PSY 2010 Disciplines & Practices in Psychology (3)

Should be taken before PSY 3060. Formerly 3930-01.

Building Research Intensive Knowledge & Skills (12 credits)

Psychologists are fundamentally scientists. This 3-course sequence builds research-related knowledge and skills that are essential to students planning academic, research, and applied careers as psychological scientists. All of the courses here include designated lab sections.

PSY 2050 Foundations of Research Methods & Statistics (4)

Offered fall and spring semesters. Best taken *before* junior year. A grade of B- or better is required.

PSY 3060 Applications of Research Methods & Statistics (4).

Offered fall semester only. Best taken after completion of 15 credits in psychology (including PSY 2010 Disciplines & Practices and PSY 2050) and during *junior* year.

PSY 4010 Advanced Statistics & Research Methods (4)

Offered spring semester only. Pre-requisite: PSY 3060. PSY 3060 and PSY 4010 are a year-long sequence. PSY 4010 must be completed in the spring semester following PSY 3060 in the fall semester.

Meeting Your Area Requirements (12 credits)

Area requirements ensure students learn about the broad areas of psychology. Courses at the 3000 level provide general overviews of topics whereas 4000 level courses are more in-depth topical seminars and/or provide professional skill development. Special topics courses (PSY 4710, 4720 4730, 4750) typically vary semester to semester.

At least one course from each topical area must be completed.

- Attendance at **Mentoring** Matters in Psychology is required for all Psychology Majors during their first and second year as a psychology major. Each year, students participate in a 90-minute Mentoring Matters session scheduled in February. Learn more about your courses, the faculty, careers in psychology, and ways to make the most of your major while you are in college.
- All psychology majors are required to meet with their faculty mentor each semester. A formal mentoring period begins directly after fall break and spring break, when faculty mentors schedule extra time to meet with mentees.
