# DANIEL L. SCHLAFLY, JR. VITA

Why did I choose history? Because by learning about the past, I hoped to understand our world today. As a twenty-oneyear-old student, I was amazed by the result of the Soviet victory in World War II when I crossed the Berlin Wall (still under construction) from free West Berlin with its independent citizens into militarized Communist East Berlin, where everyone was dispirited, everything was shabby. I have studied and taught Russia, Eastern Europe, Central Europe, and Western Europe ever since. I learned the languages, literature, arts, film, religions, politics, and economics of all these countries to share with my students why peoples and nations act as they do.

I spent eight years in Jesuit schools, then went on to graduate work in the US and abroad. I have taught for decades at Saint Louis University. I have conducted extensive research on the Society of Jesus and on cultural interactions between peoples. How do Russia and Eastern Europe view the West? How does the West view them? How have they influenced each other? I have written about an Italian teenager's inside view of Peter the Great's court, what the first Russian diplomat in America thought about the early United States, why Catherine the Great of Russia protected the Society of Jesus from its general suppression in 1773, how Jesuits from Russia saved Georgetown College in its early years, and why today's Russia rejects the Roman Catholic Church.

I particularly enjoy bringing the past to life for undergraduates from many different backgrounds and disciplines, both in survey and upper-division courses. I want Saint Louis University students to understand why Russia, Eastern Europe, Central Europe, and Western Europe are more relevant today than ever.
