Program Description: Mev Puleo was an educator, photojournalist and social change activist. A 1985 graduate of Saint Louis University, she used photographs and interviews to draw attention to the struggles and aspirations of the poor. Her book, *The Struggle is One: Voices and Visions of Liberation* (Orbis Books, 1994), provides an oral history of Latin American liberation theology coupled with striking photographs of the everyday people leading the struggle against political repression and systemic poverty. The Mev Puleo Scholarship combines formal study and experiential learning to foster awareness and understanding of the people, religion, and culture of Latin American countries.

The central component of the Mev Puleo Scholarship is an immersion experience in Latin America. This summer the program takes students to San José, Costa Rica. The Universidad Bíblica Latinoamericana will host our students. During the first week students will stay in the dorm, followed by a 2-week homestay with a Costa Rican family, and a final week back at the dorm. Round-trip airfare from St. Louis to San José, SLU travel insurance, tuition, room and board, and one 3-day excursion within Costa Rica are all covered by the scholarship. The program includes theological coursework, service-learning components, and interaction with people from many different sectors of life in Costa Rica, from Church leaders, to community organizers, to grassroots activists.

Mev's vocation of advocacy, education and art was tragically cut short by a malignant brain tumor; she died in January 1996 at the age of 32. Her parents, Peter and Evelyn Puleo, established the Mev Puleo Scholarship in Latin American Theology, Politics, & Culture in her honor, hoping that the recipients, like Mev, will become advocates for social justice.

- Are required to make a public presentation detailing their summer experiences to the SLU community during the spring 2020 ATLAS Week
- Participate in all summer coursework and other organized activities in Costa Rica
- Complete a summer journaling assignment
- Write a research paper integrating their summer experiences with the fall readings in liberation theology
