

What a wonderful gift it is to be here with you to celebrate your Pre-Commencement in community with one another. Today, with much gratitude and hope, we honor you, give heartfelt thanks to your families and friends for their love and support, and we look forward, together, to all that the future holds.

We welcome your family, friends, peers, and the faculty and staff of the School of Social Work as they participate in this ceremony that recognizes you and all your hard work. We are so grateful that we can celebrate your hard-earned achievements and cheer for you here in College Church. Yet, we know that not all our loved ones can be here with us today. We keep those not with us in our hearts as we recognize you and your accomplishments.

Today we honor a diverse group of graduates who – while connected and committed to the pursuit of servant leadership and the shared missions of Saint Louis University, the School of Social Work, and our complementary disciplines – have earned degrees in the fields of applied behavior analysis (ABA), criminology and criminal justice (CCJ), and social work (SWRK). Our class of 2024 is graduating with degrees and certificates in 20 different concentration/area combinations.

Our 2024 graduating class includes 40 undergraduate students who majored in social work and criminology and criminal justice and 93 graduate students from 63 different cities (around the globe) and 17 states across the country. More than three-quarters of our graduating class engaged in experiential learning through disciplinary practicum and internship opportunities at more than 85 local non-profit organizations, social service agencies, and justice institutions. One-fifth of our graduating class earned a perfect 4.0 GPA, and 90 percent of our undergraduates graduate with Latin honors. You represent more than 19 unique faith traditions and a broad range of educational backgrounds, having earned prior degrees at 31 universities. Wholly distinctive to Saint Louis University's School of Social Work, 10 MSW students are graduating from fully accredited, exclusive hybrid partnerships with other mission-focused colleges and universities across the country including The College of Our Lady of the Elms, a Roman Catholic school in Chicopee, Massachusetts; Avila University, a Roman Catholic school in Kansas City, Missouri; and Xavier University, a Catholic Jesuit school in Cincinnati, Ohio.

We are delighted to celebrate today's milestone in your lives and are so grateful to have shared this time and journey with you. Students like you – with outstanding intellectual ability, concern and care for others, and a fundamental desire to do well by doing good – exemplify what it means to be a Billiken. 
