

Using Panopto to Create Recorded Video Content

This document is designed for instructors who want to create and record video content for their classes using Panopto. This guide covers a series of frequently asked questions, with an emphasis on questions related to installing Panopto and using it to record and edit videos that can then be shared within Canvas. This guide is not exhaustive or intended to be a replacement for <u>Panopto support</u> or SLU ITS <u>Panopto resources</u>. Since the interface differs based on operating system, be aware of the different instructions for Windows and Mac users below.

Getting Started

	o I access Panopto? Visit the tools page in MySLU or directly access SLU's Panopto Portal (note: SLU ID credentials are required).	
How do I install Panopto on my computer?		
	Click Download Panopto in the top-right corner.	
	Install the software package on your device, and grant Panopto permission to record your	
	screen, webcam, and microphone.	
	Create a shortcut on your desktop (if desired).	
	Log in with your SLU ID and password.

How d	o I enable Panopto in my Canvas course?	
	Locate and make sure the Panopto Video link on your Course Navigation Menu is available	
_	(Note: if the link is unavailable, click Settings > Navigation > and then drag/drop the link in the available tools list at the top and click Save at the bottom).	
	Click the Panopto Video link to sync Panopto with your Canvas course (this will create a	
_	course folder in Panopto).	
	Encourage students at the beginning of the course to click the Panopto Video link to make	
	sure Panopto is synced with their Canvas accounts (Note: students can see all Panopto	
	videos uploaded to the Canvas course folder and they may need to click this link multiple	
	times, especially if they regularly log in and out or use different browsers).	
	Helpful tip: Panopto videos appear to play best in a browser other than Internet Explorer or	
	Safari. If students have difficulties accessing or viewing your videos, encourage them to	
	switch browsers (e.g., Google Chrome).

Using Panopto

How do I record video content?



	Configure your recording options:
	 Select your Canvas course in the Folder dropdown;
	 Rename the video by using the text field in Session (e.g., Cyber Security Lecture #4);
	 In the Primary Source window, choose your Primary Screen video and audio (Note)
	if you select your webcam in video, your face will be imposed on the video; if you
	select "none," only your voice is captured);
	 In the Secondary Sources window, set your Secondary Screen source (e.g.,
_	desktop, PowerPoint, web browser).
	Click the red Record button when you're reading to start recording (Note: no countdown or
	timer is provided, so be prepared to start recording immediately or edit out the first few
	seconds of the video).
	Click Pause to temporarily halt recording and Stop when recording is complete;
	In the Recording Complete window, click Done and upload your video to the Canvas
	course folder (Note: longer video recordings may take several minutes to upload).

	o I edit my videos? Click the Manage Recordings tab to view recordings completed on your desktop or locate your course folder by searching in the text field at the top or using the Browse option on the left-hand menu when viewing Panopto in a web browser. Click on Edit:
	 Cut/delete/add segments by clicking on the Scissor icon;
	 Add additional slides, YouTube videos, web links, or quizzes by clicking on the +
	icon;
	• Automatically generate captions for your content by clicking on Import Automatic
	Captions (Note: automatic captioning may not be available when you first upload a
	video due to a lag in processing/automatic voice recognition); and
	Adjust the quality, usability features, and availability of your video content by
	clicking on the Settings option.

How d	o I share my videos in Canvas?
	Click the Share option.



Options for sharing videos in Canvas. Go to your course on the Canvas dashboard, and:
 Copy and paste the embedded HTML code on a Canvas page; Edit > Insert >
Embed);
• Create an external link in a module by copying the URL; (in a module) + > External
Link > Paste video URL.
Direct students to the Panopto video link on the left-hand Course Navigation
Menu.
