²NPTE = National Physical Therapy Exam. To obtain a license to practice physical therapy in the United States, a person must have a degree in physical therapy from an accredited physical therapy program and must also pass the NPTE. Information regarding pass rates for accredited programs in the United States is available on the FSPBT website. Reported here are the pass rates for graduates of the Saint Louis University Program in Physical Therapy and National pass rates for all accredited physical therapy programs in the United States as reported by FSBPT.

³For the Program in Physical Therapy, the employment rate is defined as the percentage of DPT graduates responding to a survey who were employed as physical therapists one year after graduation.
