This Plan of Study has been determined on the basis of the Undergraduate Curriculum at Saint Louis University. Therefore, completion of the Leveling Program is dependent upon completion of each of these courses or their equivalent. Students interested in the Leveling Program apply for undergraduate admission to the University (as a transfer student) to complete the undergraduate prerequisite coursework for graduate study in Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology. A 3.3 GPA or permission from the Chair is required for admission to the Leveling Program. Completion of the Leveling Program does not guarantee admission to a graduate program. Students interested in this department's graduate program in Speech-Language Pathology must apply formally for admission by February 1, after completion of the full Fall semester of the Leveling Program.

The graduate program at Saint Louis University requires that all students complete an aural rehabilitation course. CSDI 4400 (Aural Rehabilitation) is offered in the fall semester. The above plan of study does not include the course because of the 18 credit load. For students who complete the Leveling Program, this course is typically taken in the graduate program.

Students are encouraged to complete 25 hours of observation in the leveling program.
