12.	 12. President's report and Announcement information a. The Faculty Interest survey has been sent to all faculty. Please add your own name to the list along with your interests and encourage faculty in your unit to do likewise. Having such a list is most useful when we need to quickly find faculty for committees and various working groups. If the work requires representation from each unit, then we go back to the assemblies for their recommendation. On the other hand, if the FSEC is asked for say 4 faculty, and 2 will be selected, then it is better to pull those faculty who have an interest/expertise in the pertinent area. The FSEC can do this relatively quickly, thus providing 		

shorter turn-around time for requests. We have already used the list to suggest and/or nominate faculty to a number of committees this semester.

- b. The Faculty Senate suggestion/question link is active on the Senate website and is being monitored. Because these responses are generated by several members of the FSEC, we plan to utilize the Faculty Senate email address. Currently, the responses have been limited to Faculty Senators while ITS fixes the issues with tapping the all faculty list serve.
- c. For reports from standing committees, Faculty Senate representatives to other University committees, and college/school assemblies, please note that if the report is minor -i.e., "the committee will meet on..." or "we elected a new chair..." or something similar – it would be best to submit the report in a written format. The written report will be noted on the agenda and available to senators. If the report calls for an action or activity by the Senate, then by all means, present it verbally and call for the action. We are trying to eliminate the need to take up senate time with points that can be simply read by senators. Not everyone needs to present each meeting. We are not telling anyone that they cannot speak to the Senate if they think their report is important or requires an action. Rather, we are attempting to have those things that just need a reading be posted as such. Also, if in reading something, any senator may raise a question about any such report. All of this is an attempt to be a bit more streamlined and efficient. We know that everyone's time is valuable. You can send these reports directly to the Faculty Senate Secretary for inclusion in the meeting materials.
- d. In the interest of senators being able to report back to their units, we will try to better provide materials generated in a meeting (things like reports, PowerPoints, etc.) in a timelier manner. Assuming that we receive such materials, we will try to send them to senators soon after the meeting and not just with the materials for the next meeting.

 - SLU's policy focus on individuals taking more personal responsibility
 - Current rates: St Louis is now within what CDC is calling "medium risk"- infection rates are high but hospitalization rates are dropping
 - Current policies: Students who test positive are required to isolate and test out of isolation

- Fall 2022 is the 4th largest class in 20 years 13,546
- SLU has seen a 13% increase in grant funding since 2020. The Provost recognizes the importance of unfunded research and will try to document faculty trajectory of these types of research endeavors in future presentations.
- The Provost presented several objectives for student success (including access programs, first-year experience, career services, academic success, institutional research, registrar) and the intended actions to achieve these.
- IGNITE seminars Additional faculty are needed to teach these seminars. The seminars are for undergrads only (first year Freshman and first year transfers). The opportunity to submit an IGNITE seminar is open until October 17th. - Note: There are two kinds of IGNITE seminars: Locked Ignite Seminars are those in which students are "locked" into taking because of their major (e.g. Engineering, Nursing, etc.)
 Open Ignite Seminars are those that are open to all students except for those who are required to take "locked" ones.
- Update on the Academic Strategic Plan (Michael Lewis) Q&A see slides
 - The Provost highlighted 4 strategic priorities: teaching and learning; research, scholarship, and creative work; advancing well-being and equity; expanding access and reach. Within these the Provost highlighted specific activities including those related to student well-doing and diversity, and issues and concerns related to IRB and indirect costs, mentorship, etc.
 - The Provost indicated at once the priorities and goals are published at the end of October there will be a mechanism for anyone to submit ideas to advance one or more of the goals in the plan which may include sponsorship for their ideas.
