As signed and agreed to, Saint Louis University was awarded additional funding from the ARP of to assist students with emergency needs.

For the end of Fall 2021 (October 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021) a total of \$1,112,400.00 was disbursed to 1545 students.

The University determined awards by selecting Pell recipients from the Fall 2021 term. Pell Grant recipients were automatically notified of awards.

(1) An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Saint Louis University signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, CRRSAA and ARP to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

(2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Since January 18, 2021 to December 31,2021, a total of \$10,059,498 has been awarded to students.

During Q4 (October 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021) a total of \$1,112,400.00 was disbursed to 1545 students. All students were Pell recipients.

(4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Based on the University's total enrollment, an estimated 12,000 were eligible to apply for grant consideration under the American Rescue Plan.

(5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

The total number of student awards from CRRSAA and ARP is 6170 (HEERF II and ARP). The unduplicated number is 3,740.

During Q4 (October 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021) a total of \$1,112,400.00 was disbursed to 1545 students.

Fall 2021 Awarding:
