## SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL *Aid*

The Office of Admissions looks forward to reviewing your application. In addition to your high school or university transcripts, our staff review your university entrance exam scores, leadership involvement, extra-curricular activities, community service, letters of recommendation, personal essay and other materials you wish to include to support your application.

Whether you are looking to begin your university studies or transfer to SLU from another institution, you will be considered for a Madrid Campus merit-based scholarship when your application is reviewed for admission. U.S. citizens and permanent residents are also eligible to apply for U.S. federal financial aid through FAFSA.

All students may apply for administrative support scholarships. These scholarships reduce tuition fees while giving you professional experience through collaboration with administrative offices on campus, such as Admissions, Finance, Information Technology, Marketing and Communications, the Library and Student Life.

The Madrid Campus offers financial aid to more than half of its students.

## STUDY IN THE *USA*

Are you interested in studying both in Madrid and in the United States? Many of our academic programs like engineering and nursing enable you to begin your degree in Spain and complete it on our St. Louis Campus.

Founded in 1818, Saint Louis University is the oldest university west of the Mississippi River, the second-oldest Jesuit university in the nation. The city of St. Louis is located near the geographical center of the U.S. and holds a central place in American history as well. It served as the gateway to the West for the wagon trail, the landing from where Mississippi's great steamboats launched, and once the world's busiest railroad hub. This constant movement of people over the centuries gives St. Louis a surprisingly cultured air.

In St. Louis, the University enrolls nearly 13,000 students, including over 8,000 undergraduates from all 50 states and more than 75 foreign countries. The campus boasts 134 buildings on 271 acres of land in Midtown St. Louis. The university continually invests in new and modern facilities with the intent of maximizing student success. Whether it's in the state-of-the-art classrooms or one of the new residence halls currently under construction, SLU's focus remains on what will benefit you.
