EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:

- Discuss common procedures in ambulatory care in relation to their causes, incidence of, indications and contraindications for each procedure.
- Describe the basic skin anatomy, discuss the etiology of wounds and factors affecting wound healing, along with anesthesia and cleansing products
- Perform basic, interrupted suture (square) knots and running suture and removal
- Perform a vertical and horizontal mattress suture, subcutaneous sutures, and flap laceration repair
- Discuss the techniques for staple insertion/removal and skin adhesive application/care
- Select appropriate wound care instructions based on the type of wound repair
- Demonstrate incision and drainage of an abscess
- Discuss and perform cryosurgery and punch biopsy
- Explain the procedure for and demonstrate various nerve blocks
- Discuss and perform cortisone injections of the upper and lower extremities
- Review normal and abnormal xray findings of the chest and abdomen
- Describe the technique for lumbar puncture
