SLO #5 Data/Results

- 1. The data from the clinical evaluations tools Level 1, 2, and 3 were available from the following courses: NURS 2520, NURS 3435, NURS 3445, NURS 3565 and NURS 3575, NURS 3485, NURS 3495, and NURS 4355. This data was primarily collected by face-to-face clinical instructors during on-ground clinical experiences in off-campus hospitals and clinics through the STL metro area. For the item utilize critical thinking and problem-solving skills, in application of the nursing process, to achieve optimal client adaptation, 100% of the students achieved a satisfactory score by the final clinal evaluation assessment.
- 2. The ATI RN Comprehensive Predictor Exam was given in NURS 4405 and the group report was generated in ATI analytics. The aggregate score on the ATI Comprehensive Predictor exam for RN planning was 76.7%
- 3. The final aggregated NCLEX pass rate was 90%. This results includes students who graduated from the Accelerated MSN and Traditional BSN program. The results from this report are not specific to the program from which the students graduated.
- 4. The Skyfactor MAP Works report results from graduates of 2022 aggregate scores were 84.8%(use appropriate technologies to assess); 84.7% (assess predictive factors that influence the health of patients); 89%(provide pain reduction measures); 78.7% (Manage wounds); 82.5% (evaluate individual's ability to assume responsibility for self-care)

- 3. The final aggregated NCLEX pass rate was 90%. This results includes students who graduated from the Accelerated MSN and Traditional BSN program. The results from this report are not specific to the program from which the students graduated.
- 4. The Skyfactor MAP Works report results from graduates of 2022 aggregate scores (Indirect measure) were 82.5% (assist patients to interpret the meaning of health information); 86% (act as an advocate for vulnerable patients); 88.8% (Honor the rights of patient to make decisions about their health care) 79.3% (assist patient to achieve a peaceful end of life) on the Skyfactor MAP Works survey administered to graduates upon completion of the program.

- 2. The ATI RN Comprehensive Predictor Exam was given in NURS 4405 and the group report was generated in ATI analytics. The aggregate score on the ATI Comprehensive Predictor exam for RN interprofessional communication was 75.1%
- 3. The final aggregated NCLEX pass rate was 90%. This result includes students from the Accelerated MSN and Traditional BSN program. The results from this report are not specific to the program from which the students graduated.
- 4. The Skyfactor MAP Works report results from graduates of 2022 aggregate scores (Indirect measure) were 85% (communication with health care professionals to deliver high quality patient care) 86.2% (Interprofessional communication and collaboration to improve patient health outcomes) on the Skyfactor MAP Works survey administered to graduates upon completion of the program.

- 2. The ATI RN Comprehensive Predictor Exam was given in NURS 4405 and the group report was generated in ATI analytics. The aggregate score on the ATI Comprehensive Predictor exam for RN scholarship for evidence-based practice was 74.2%
- 3. The final aggregated NCLEX pass rate was 90%. This results includes students who graduated from the Accelerated MSN and Traditional BSN program. The results from this report are not specific to the program from which the students graduated.
- 4. The Skyfactor MAP Works report results from graduates of 2022 aggregate scores were 83% (apply research-based knowledge as basis for practice).
- 5. The Evidence synthesis assignment was given on the fall of 2021. 100% of students earned a score greater than 80% on this assignment.

100% of students achieved a score of satisfactory on all clinical evaluations.

This data tell us that the clinical experiences in NURS 2520, 3435, 3445, 3565, 3575, 3485, 3495, 4355 and theory instruction and assignments in NURS 2705, and NURS 4405 provide adequate opportunities for students to utilize critical thinking and problem solving skills in the application of the nursing process, to achieve optimal client adaptation, Assist clients, at any point on the health-illness continuum, to mobilize and use adaptive resources for promotion, maintenance and restoration of health, collaborate with interprofessional colleagues, community representatives, and consumers to enhance health care, and to Apply evidence-based knowledge as the basis for safe, effective nursing practice.

The School of Nursing is currently engaged in a comprehensive review of the undergraduate and prelicensure curriculum. This report was shared with ABSN faculty and the UPPC in August 2022, and was updated in January 2023 when the Skyfactor report was available and again in May 2023 then the NCLEX report was available from Mountain Measurement. This final report will be shared with the ABSN faculty on August 14, 2023 and will them be shared with the UPPC.

If no changes are being made, please explain why.

No specific changes are being made to the curriculum at this time. However, faculty can use this data to support the adoption of alternate assignments in their clinical courses.

The program faculty identified that the compressed nature of the summer term is challenging for student. A concerted group effort was made to schedule courses in a way that would optimize student learning and enhance student success.

We are not observing any changes in our student success on achieving SLO assessed in this report
