

Missouri Voters' Opinions of Political Actors and the Direction of State & Country

The following document summarizes the opinions of likely voters in Missouri on state and federal political actors over time. These results are from SLU/YouGov Polls conducted from June 2020 to February 2025. This document also includes voters' views on whether the state of Missouri and the United States has been on the right track since 2021. The SLU/YouGov Poll is a biannual survey of likely Missouri voters aiming to inform policymakers, citizens, and researchers of Missourians' opinions on important issues facing the state.

Over Time Summary: Among likely Missouri voters, 19% more voters approve President Trump's performance in the February 2025 SLU/YouGov Poll compared to President's Biden's approval in February 2024. During that time, approval of the U.S. Congress grew by 27% and 33% more voters believe the U.S. is on the right track. Senators Josh Hawley and Eric Schmitt's approval ratings respectively increased by 1% and 7% since February 2024.
