Missouri Voters' Opinions on Guns and Public Safety Issues

The following document summarizes the opinions of likely voters in Missouri on issues related to guns and safety, including school safety. These results are from SLU/YouGov Polls conducted from June 2020 to February 2025. This document also includes national polling on guns and safety conducted by YouGov independent of Saint Louis University. The SLU/YouGov Poll is a biannual survey of likely Missouri voters aiming to inform policymakers, citizens, and researchers of Missourians' opinions on important issues facing the state.

Key Missouri Findings

- 39% of voters support state control over the St. Louis Police Department. 48% support local control (Feb. 2025 Poll)
- At least 57 percent of Democratic, Republican, and Independent voters support background checks for buying guns/firearms (<u>June 2020</u>, <u>Aug. 2022</u>, <u>Feb. 2023</u>, <u>Aug. 2024 Poll</u>)
- 85% of voters support banning minors from carrying guns on public property without adult supervision (<u>Aug. 2024</u> <u>Poll</u>)
- 10 percent or fewer voters support banning all guns, handguns, or hunting rifles (Feb. 2023 Poll)
- 56 percent of voters are worried about a shooting happening at public schools in Missouri (Feb. 2023 Poll)
