Position description:

The Graduate Assistant for Wellness reports directly to the Assistant Director for Health Promotion and Education. This position is responsible for assisting in the development, implementation, and evaluation of wellness programs that promote and support healthy student involvement within the Saint Louis University community. This person will have the opportunity to promote intentional student development and learning through Campus Recreation and Wellness initiatives. They will work in collaboration with the department's professional staff to help facilitate the day-to-day activities of the department. Additional responsibilities may be assigned according to the discretion of the Assistant Director for Health Promotion and Education.

Job Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assist in developing and leading comprehensive health promotion and education strategies and programs with a focus on alcohol and other drug education, sexual assault prevention, bystander intervention, mental health, suicide prevention, and personal wellness that reflect the values of the University and meet the needs of a diverse student body
- Work in collaboration with the department's Health Education Action Team (HEAT) peer educators to promote and maintain a campus focus on well-being, utilizing the eight dimensions of wellness (emotional, physical, spiritual, social, occupational, intellectual, environmental, and financial)
- Assist with programming for special events and awareness weeks/months such as
 University Wellness Days, Health & Wellness Fairs, Alcohol and Other Drug Education
 Week, Body Neutrality Week, Mental Wellness Week, Suicide Prevention Week,
 Domestic Violence Month, and more
- Provide wellness presentations to students, faculty, and staff

- Assist in the management of special events
- Assist with the implementation, administration, and management of the department's marketing efforts
- Assist in the creation, distribution, and compilation of assessment instruments to determine program effectiveness and participant satisfaction
- Collaborate with other departments within the Division of Student Development on projects, initiatives, and committees
- Uphold University policies and graduate assistant expectations and maintain scheduled office hours
- Represent the Department of Campus Recreation and Wellness in a professional manner
- Participate in personal and professional development
- Perform special projects and other duties as assigned
